These are just a sampling of the innovative support services offered to participants in the AAMSI program. Since its beginning in 2019, 61 program participants have overcome racial and gender achievement gaps to graduate from Greenville Technical College – with over 50% of those graduates earning their degrees in 2022.

Stellar results tracked by an outside evaluator show that the AAMSI persistence rate (enrollment from Fall to Spring terms) outpaces all Greenville Technical College students. Additionally, 60.4% of AAMSI scholars are retained from one year to the next, exceeding the retention rate of Greenville Technical College white males and non-AAMSI males.

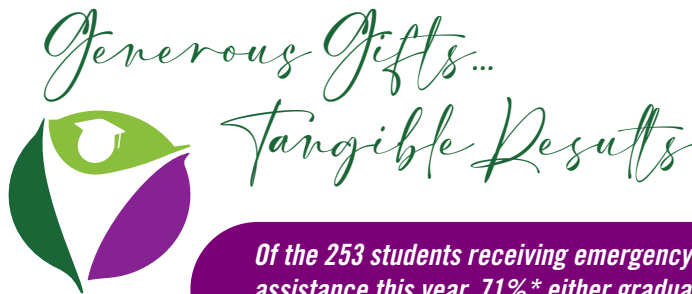
When sudden circumstances create student emergency needs, the STAR (Student Assistance and Resources) Center provides a helping hand through financial gifts and pantry items donated through the Foundation. What seems simple to most of us – repairing a flat tire, paying an unexpected medical bill, registering for degree-mandated tests or purchasing expensive course kits – can be a barrier to our students and prevent them from completing their degrees.

In fact, a 2021 survey* of our students indicated that 69% experienced a basic needs insecurity in the prior year.

The results of emergency assistance speak for themselves. Faith Bennett, a nursing major and recent graduate, came to the Foundation within a few months of commencement. Last minute testing fees seemed insurmountable – and she was so close to walking across the stage! Your generosity pushed her over the finish line and she is now enjoying a wonderful position as a Nurse Resident at Prisma Health's Children's Emergency Department.

From expensive car repairs, to food insecurity, to rent payments, Stevie Johnson also saw his dreams of graduation vanishing before his eyes. He leaned on the Greenville Tech Foundation, and our Emergency Assistance program carried him on the last leg of his journey and into an exciting new career in mechatronics. The barriers Stevie faced near the end of his college career could have stopped him before he reached his goals, but your gifts kept Stevie in the game and added his name to a long list of Greenville Technical College success stories.

Generous gifts from individuals, corporations, and foundations created a banner year for scholarship assistance among Greenville Technical College students in 2022. A record \$704,000+ in awards to our students helped keep their dreams of a college education in sight. New scholarship funds were created and added to our roster of existing scholarships to create an unprecedented number of opportunities for our students. The Sudduth Family Endowed Scholarship is one of ten new awards established this year and is already opening doors to higher education for students demonstrating financial need.

After serving four years in the US Navy, David Sudduth completed several college transfer courses at Greenville Technical College before finishing his undergraduate degree in Financial Management at Clemson University. While working full-time during the day, David attended evening classes and earned his MBA several years later. He now serves as the Executive Director for Healthy Me-Healthy SC where he leads numerous health initiatives that serve rural and underserved communities across SC. David's wife, Kathy, also graduated from Clemson, securing a nursing degree and working for 46 years in both adult and pediatric neurology with the Greenville Health System (now Prisma Health).

A member of the Foundation's Board of Directors, David will assume the role of Board Chair in 2023.

Corporations like Strategic Development Group also supported our students in 2022 by providing scholarships for three students enrolled in advanced manufacturing courses. Their gift reflected the value they place on technical education.

Kerry Worley first encountered Greenville Technical College when she enrolled in an Allied Health program in 2011. Because of her positive experience with this program, she knew GTC was the place for her when she decided to pursue her nursing studies a decade later.

From the teachers she describes as "phenomenal," to the small class size and individualized attention she receives as a student, Kerry can't say enough great things about her college education. She also points to scholarship assistance provided by Foundation donors as one of the keys to her success. The burden of testing fees, uniforms, and other "extras" that are a part of her true cost of attendance were lightened by generous awards like the one she received through the Spinks Family Endowed Fund.

Endowed by Stewart Spinks in 2011, this scholarship gives preference to company employees or their immediate family members who are enrolled as students at Greenville Technical College and have financial need. Since it was established, this fund has benefited a long line of students who are considered part of the "Spinks Family."

Kerry looks forwards to securing her degree this summer and hopes to work as a wound care and ostomy nurse. In her words, the Spinks Family Endowed Scholarship "allows me to focus on gaining the knowledge to better serve our community and my patients." The investment of our donors through scholarships cascades from our students to the community and beyond through students like Kerry Worley as they pursue exciting and rewarding career paths that are fueled by a Greenville Technical College education.

Lockheed Martin

Lockheed Martin has supported the Aircraft Maintenance Technology (AMT) program and the college in a variety of ways for more than two decades, including providing more than \$400,000 in charitable contributions. Some of these donations have been used for an endowed scholarship fund, which has provided nearly 90 scholarships to date, removing financial barriers for students seeking to enter the aviation maintenance industry. In 2022, five talented AMT students were awarded generous scholarships from Lockheed Martin's endowed fund.

A 2014 gift helped create campus-based centers where veterans can gather and study. And at the Greenville Technical College Aviation Center, students learn foundational aviation skills in the Lockheed Martin Fabrication Lab — all designed to help them prepare for long-term, fulfilling careers in the aviation industry.

After seeing impactful results from a two-week pre-apprenticeship training program that Lockheed Martin and the College began in 2020, company and college leadership decided to implement a new six-week apprenticeship program, in which participants are treated as Lockheed Martin employees, do not pay tuition, and are offered positions as full-time apprentices upon completion. The program's first cohort of 12 students graduated at the end of 2022 and have begun work as sheet metal apprentices, supporting the site's F-16 Production Operations, which recently achieved first flight of its first new F-16 Block 70 aircraft.

Plans are underway for the next cohort, which is set to begin in mid-2023, depending on demand needs.

Prisma Health Center for Health & Life Sciences

Impacting Innovative Learning Opportunities

On October 5th, Gov. Henry McMaster joined College, Foundation, and community leaders to break ground for the Prisma Health Center for Health & Life Sciences, thanks to a \$1.5 million lead gift from the state's largest healthcare organization and the number one employer of Greenville Technical College graduates.

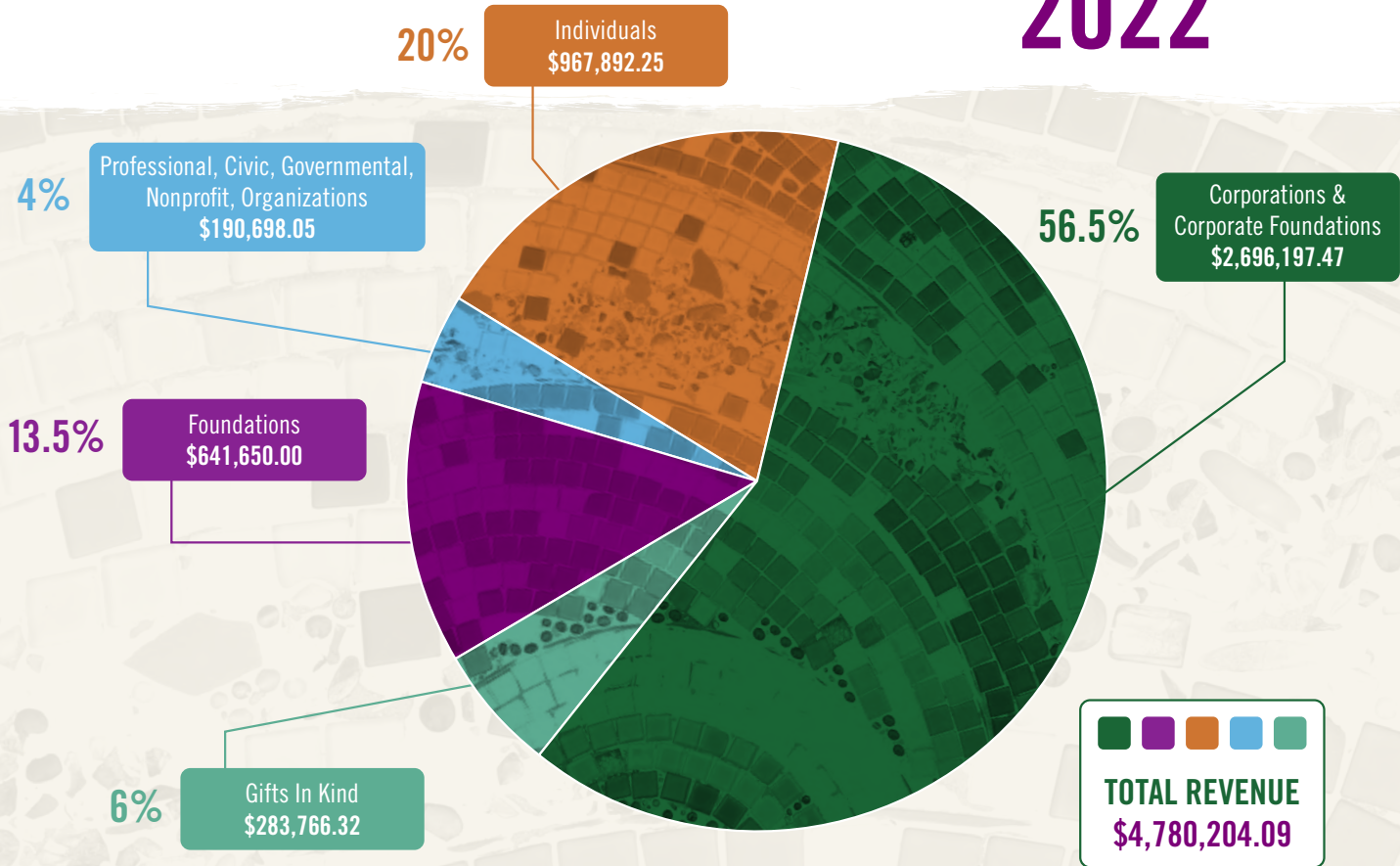
The 125,000 square foot, 3-story building is expected to open its doors in the Fall of 2024 with a melding of science (including physics, anatomy, physiology, biology, microbiology, and physical sciences), language, social sciences, humanities, and health sciences in one space. With an eye toward creating student-focused, flexible, and dynamic learning environments to support rapidly changing workforce needs, the building will house classrooms, labs, office spaces, and common areas that provide:

- Varying modes of learning
- Hands-on experiences through science labs — like the Anatomage Lab with virtual dissection tables using fully interactive, life-size touch screens
- Space for deeper engagement between faculty/staff and students
- Medical Imaging suites

The new Prisma Health Center for Health & Life Sciences is expected to impact 90% of Greenville Technical College students. Connection, collaboration, and learning will be at the heart of this innovative new space.



Revenue by Sources 2022



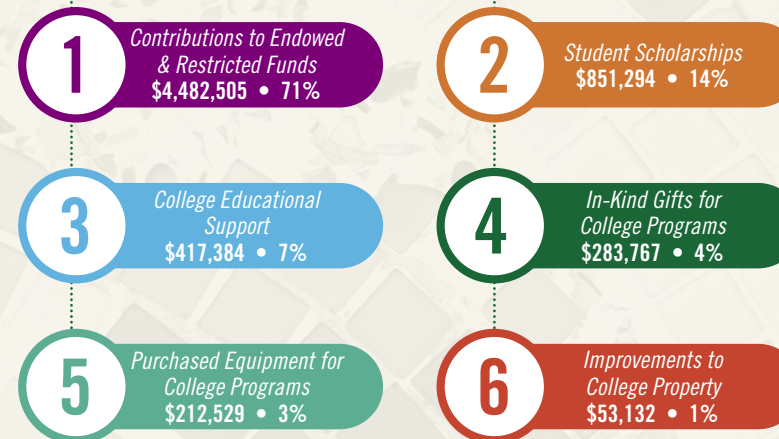
High Five!
