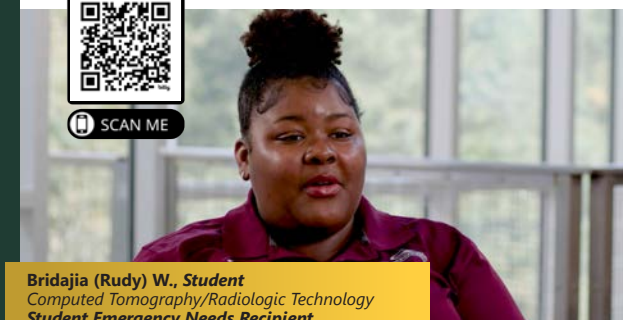

IMPACTING STUDENT ACCESS

In 2023, thanks to the support from individuals, corporations, and foundations, we were able to award 835 scholarships totaling over \$784,000+ to Greenville Technical College students. These scholarships provide critical financial assistance that helps students achieve their educational goals and paves the way for a brighter future.

Peg and Harry van Bergen, residents of The Woodlands at Furman, were recently honored by Greenville Technical College as *Unsung Heroes* for their dedication to education and community service.

The couple established the Harmannus H. van Bergen Endowed Scholarship in March 2019, giving preference to students who are employed at The Woodlands at Furman. Harry, who arrived in the United States as an immigrant child speaking no English, credits his success to his education and his determination to improve his situation. He hopes to light a spark in the recipient by offering this opportunity for advancement.

In addition to their support of student scholarships, the van Bergens are members of the Foundation's Legacy Society, having included the Foundation in their estate plans.

Peg and Harry met in Greenwood, South Carolina, where she taught French and he worked as a member of the van Bergen family bell and carillon business. They married, raised a family, had successful careers in Georgia and South Carolina, and retired to Greenville, South Carolina, where continuing education and community involvement keep life interesting.

Today, Peg and Harry continue to encourage potential students to find their paths at Greenville Technical College and encourage others to support scholarships through their charitable giving.

PRISMA HEALTH CENTER FOR HEALTH & LIFE SCIENCES

Greenville Technical College's newest facility, the Prisma Health Center for Health & Life Sciences, is set to open its doors for Fall Term 2024. The building will be central to empowering individuals, changing lives, and reshaping communities by impacting 90% of our students, welcoming over 150,000 visitors annually, and serving 100% of the 500-600 health sciences graduates that Greenville Technical College contributes to the local workforce each year.

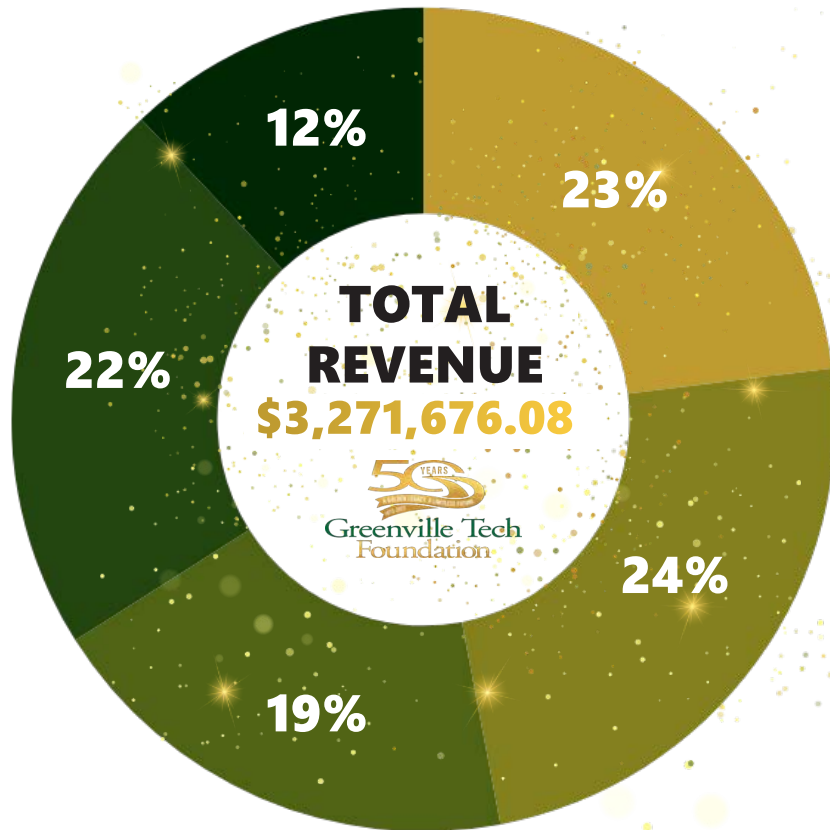
FEATURES AND BENEFITS

The three-story, 125,000+ SF facility includes:

- + A **medical imaging suite**, including both ultrasound and rad tech learning spaces. Students will supplement their classroom education with real-life experience in our on-campus OB Ultrasound Clinic, providing free 3D and 4D ultrasounds to more than 200 expectant mothers each year. With a demonstration/teaching lab, a radiation technology area, and three energized direct digital X-ray labs for active learning, the Rad Tech Suite will provide a simulated work environment that permits students to gain experience using contemporary equipment comparable to future employment facilities.
- + The **Active Learning Lab**, which will allow students to collaborate in groups and project their work onto large format screens.
- + The **Ideation Room** where students, faculty and staff brainstorm and move ideas from conception to real-world application and implementation.
- + An **anatomage lab** featuring two virtual dissection tables with fully interactive, life-size touch screens for a 3D anatomy and physiology learning approach. The lab will introduce new virtual reality and augmented reality tools for additional collaboration among health science departments.
- + Multiple upgraded, enlarged **science labs** to empower students studying Medical Terminology, Anatomy & Physiology, and Physics to integrate their classroom learning with hands-on experience.
- + **Classrooms, office spaces, a student lounge, and common areas** for radiological and imaging sciences, general education, English, and math instruction - with spaces for studying and collaboration.

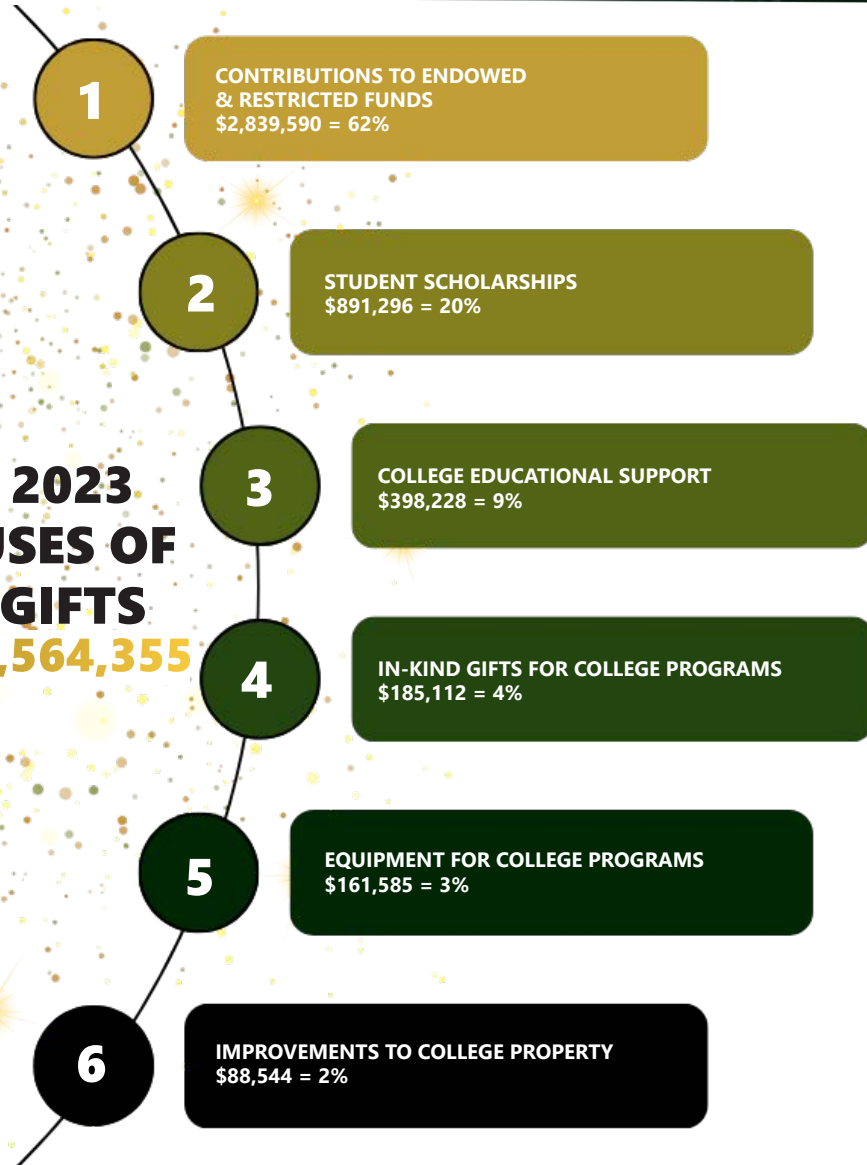

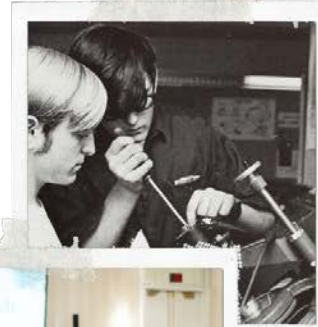
