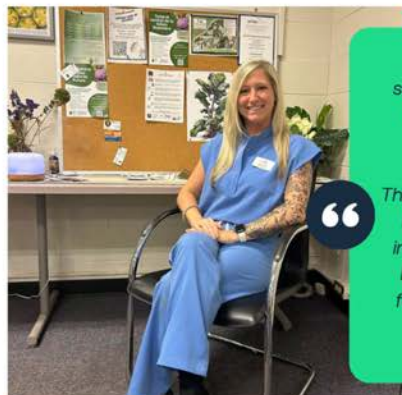

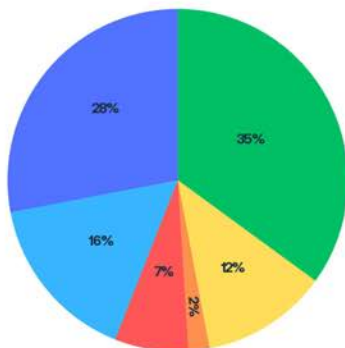

# A CENTERPIECE ON THE PATH TO PROGRESS OPENS

Greenville Technical College held a ribbon-cutting on August 20, 2024, for the Prisma Health Center for Health & Life Sciences. Designed with a “learning on display” concept, the building features collaborative spaces, modern classrooms, and a preserved historic tree from the college’s founding.

**Honoring a Legacy of Faith, Service, and Advocacy: The Willie B. McMahan Family Endowment**

Rev. Dr. Willie B. McMahan served the Greenville community for decades as a beloved pastor, public servant, and advocate for education. He led Flat Rock Baptist Church with compassion and conviction, and he also served two terms in the South Carolina House of Representatives—where he was instrumental in securing funding for Greenville Technical College. In his memory, his six children—David, Donnie, Aretha, Willie Jr. (Sonny), Samuel, and Joseph—established the Willie B. McMahan Family Endowment to support students at the College.

On December 4, Greenville Technical College celebrated the reopening of the Margaret Mills Cabbage Child Development Center on the Barton Campus after a major renovation.

Originally opened in 1988 and renamed in 2001 in honor of Leighton Cabbage's mother, a beloved kindergarten teacher, the center continues to reflect her legacy of nurturing and belief in the power of education.

"My mother believed in me fiercely," said Cabbage. "Naming the center in her honor is about carrying that belief forward—for every child who walks through those doors."

That legacy lives on in more ways than one. Kristin, Cabbage's daughter, carries her grandmother's name—Margaret—as her middle name and has chosen a career teaching children, further extending the impact of her grandmother's devotion to early education.

Cabbage's commitment to education doesn't end there—he has also established an endowed scholarship fund and has included the Foundation in his estate plans to ensure continued impact for future generations.

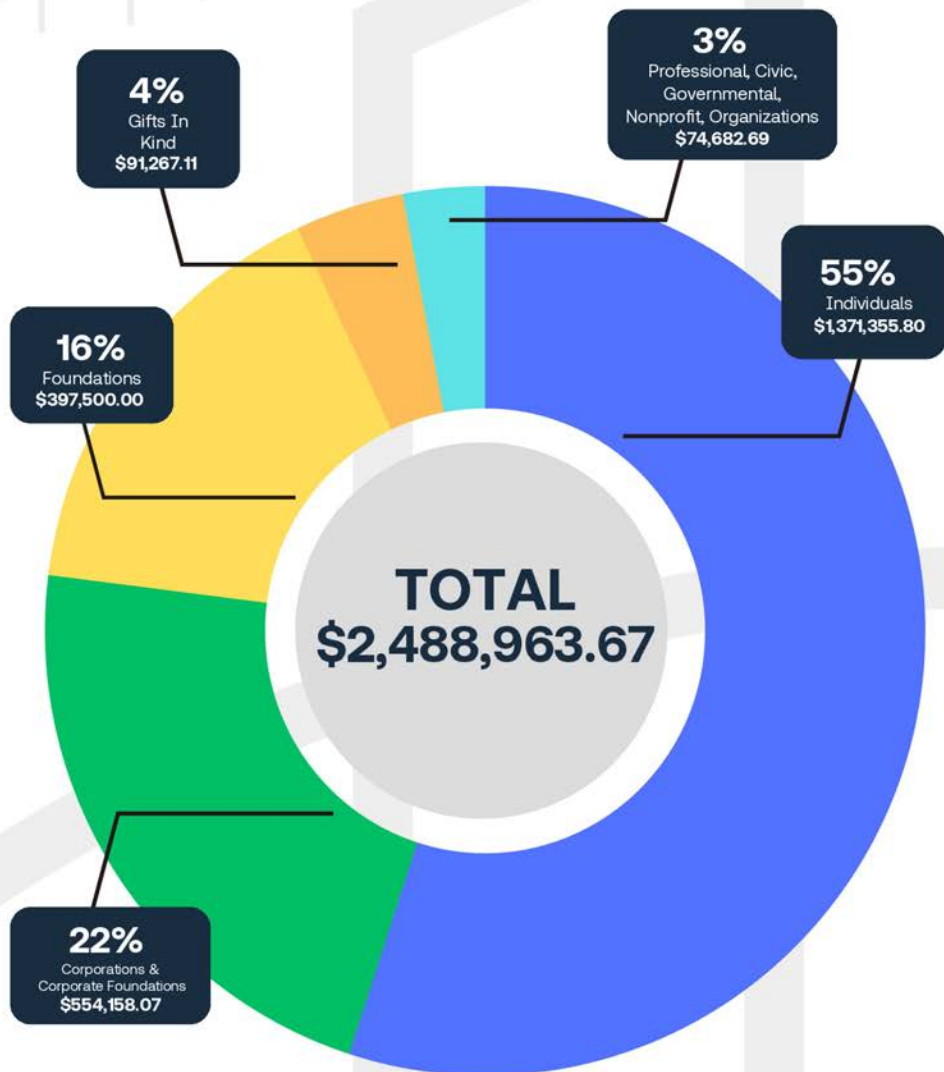
***"You can put something in place so that when you're gone, it keeps doing good,"*** he shared. ***"That's the kind of giving that matters."***

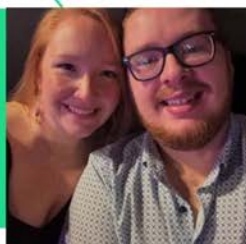
