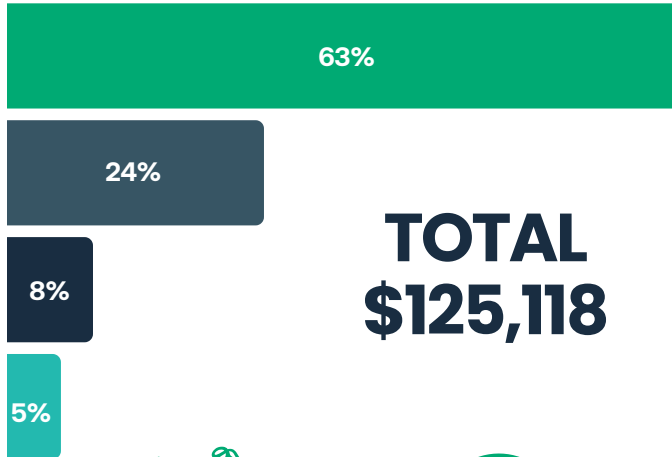

In fall 2025, basic-needs resources expanded to the **Benson, Brashier, and Northwest campuses**, bringing vital food assistance closer to students across Greenville County — including those enrolled in online programs. The Caring Corner introduced Smiota lockers, providing a **discreet, convenient way** for students to access support when and where they need it. By removing **barriers to food access**, this expansion helps students remain **healthy, focused, and on track to complete their education**.

After more than 22 years as a sheet metal mechanic and welder, a lupus diagnosis forced Christian to leave the physically demanding career he knew. Determined to begin again, he enrolled at Greenville Technical College and has maintained continuous recovery since April 2021 while pursuing an Associate in Applied Science in Respiratory Care.

Through the support of the Center for Collegiate Recovery, Christian has found encouragement, structure, and a community that reinforces both his recovery and academic goals.

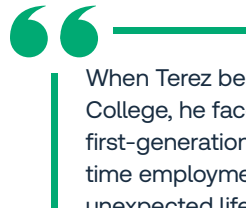

In **April 2025**, Greenville Technical College leaders, faculty, students, and community partners broke ground on the **Center for Welding and Automation Excellence** at the Brashier Campus — a bold investment in addressing a critical workforce shortage.

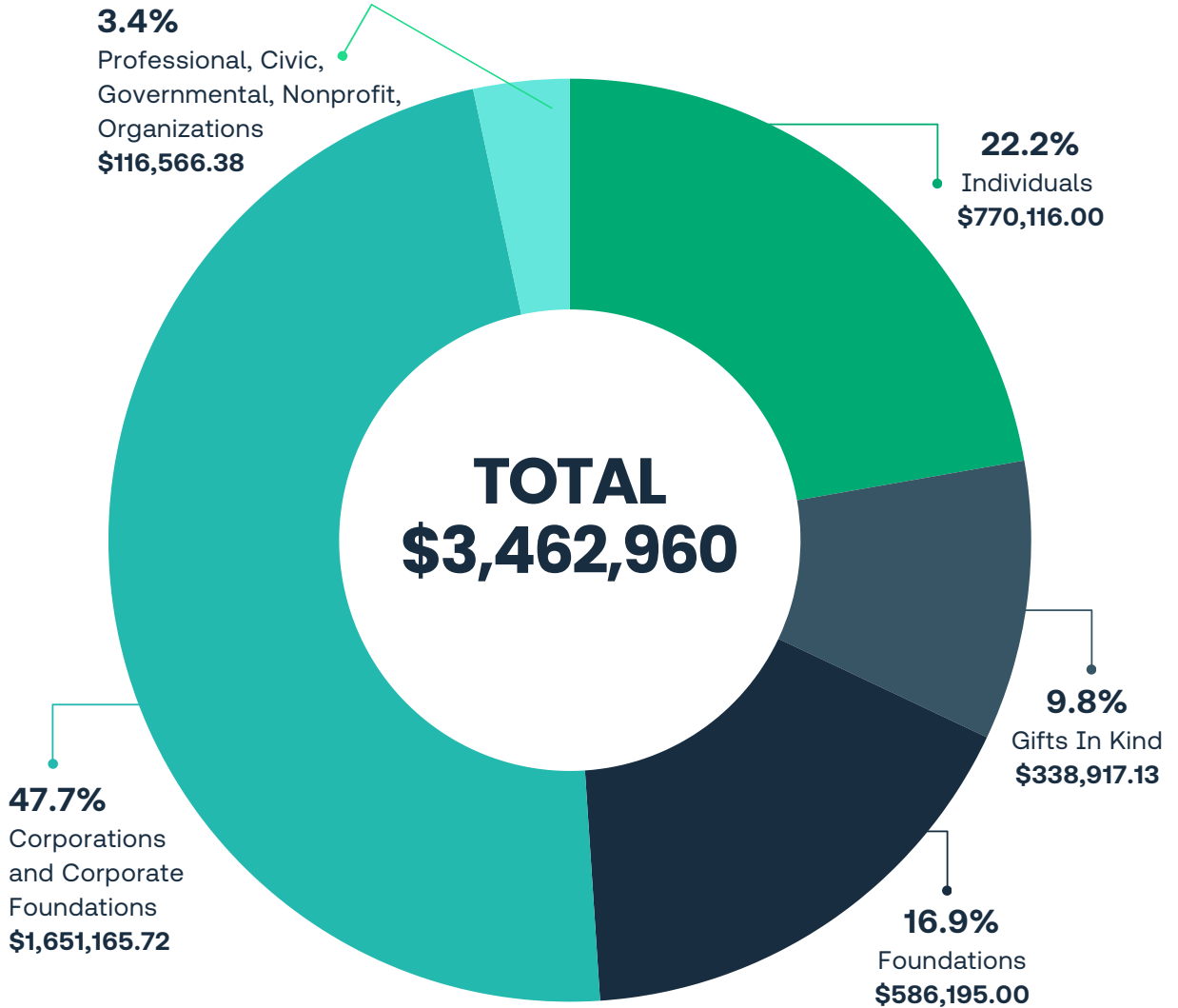

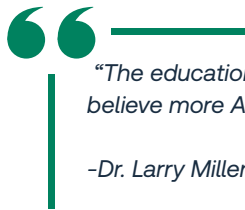




A NEW CHAPTER IN LEADERSHIP

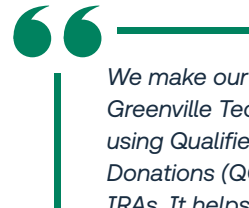
